

Teaching HSC Students Research Ethics

SUMMARY

At present, several New South Wales Stage 6 subjects, as well as the International Baccalaureate, feature projects that involve human participants as a significant part of assessment. These include Community and Family Studies, Health and Movement Science (formerly PDHPE), Geography, and Society and Culture.

The Teaching HSC Students Research Ethics microcredential supports secondary teachers in the teaching of ethical research practices and their application in student research projects that involve human participants. You'll gain an understanding of the *Australian Code for the Responsible Conduct of Research*, 2018 and acquire the skills to identify resources that support students in applying ethics to their data collection methodologies; for example, the key features of an ethically sound consent form.
